BOIL WATER ADVISORY LIFTED IN THE CITY OF JONESVILLE

The boil water advisory for City of Jonesville water customers has been lifted, effective immediately. The advisory was issued on February 4th, after the system experienced a loss in water pressure. The City followed procedures established by the Michigan Department of Environmental Quality (MDEQ) to complete two rounds of water tests. Test results taken at several locations around the water system have confirmed that the water is safe to drink.

The advisory was issued out of an abundance of caution to protect the health of those who use City water, due to the possibility of harmful bacteria entering the system during the loss in pressure.

“The City of Jonesville is grateful for the patience and understanding of the residents and businesses on the City’s water system during this situation,” said City Manager Jeff Gray.

Gray noted that the water line break occurred in a privately owned building following the extreme cold of last week. Gray said, “This incident serves as a reminder to all property owners to properly maintain their buildings and plumbing to assure that they do not inadvertently affect others connected to the public water system.”
